Byelaw Strategy Working Group Progress Report April 2022

Recommendations

- 1. That this report is accepted.
- 2. That the TSB Sub-Committee endorse further work by the Byelaw Strategy Working Group to develop and propose new byelaws to attain the goal of having a single suite of NWIFCA Byelaws in place within a period of 5 years.

Background

- The Byelaw Strategy Working Group ("BSWG") was established by a resolution of the TSB Sub-Committee meeting in April 2021 with the aim of establishing a single suite NWIFCA byelaws for the District within a period of 5 years. This aim was endorsed at the Quarterly meeting of the Authority in March 2022.
- 2. The BSWG has met on four occasions to discuss how to progress from the current suite of 47 byelaws made by 5 different organisations towards the aim of a single suite of NWIFCA byelaws.
- 3. The purpose of this report is to provide a brief update on progress.

Progress Update

The BSWG has identified the key components of a future NWIFCA suite of byelaws, briefly summarised in the

- 1. Table 1 overleaf.
- 2. Key points to note about this list are:
 - a. There are three broad categories: byelaws already in place; byelaws we are certain that the NWIFCA will need; and those that require further consideration.
 - b. There may be omissions from the list. Comments are invited on omissions.
 - c. The list is not prioritised. Comments are invited on priorities. Members have previously agreed that the final decision on priorities should be taken by Officers.

Next Steps

The BSWG is keen to make progress with drafting proposals for new byelaws. The BSWG is due to meet again on 24th May so that it can finalise the list set out in

- 1. Table 1 and start work on the top priorities in this list.
- 2. Updates on progress will be reported to future TSB meetings.
