## **BASS UPDATE**

Purpose: To provide an update for members on the current regulations relating to Bass.

**Recommendations:**

## **New Regulations**

- 1. Members will be aware that that since 2015 EU wide regulations for the management of Bass (*Dicentrarchus labrax*) have been published as part of the EUs annual opportunities to fish regulations.
- 2. It is the same for 2017 with Council Regulation 2017/127. The regulation is prohibitive and captures a wider scope of activity than the previous years. The full regulation is given in Annex 1.
- 3. In <u>summary</u> the regulation implements the following within commercial fisheries from vessels and <u>from the shore</u>:
  - The prohibition of the retention, relocation, transshipment or landing of Bass inside the 12nm within VIIa
- 4. The regulation then derogates against that prohibition for the following:
  - A 3% and 400kg by-catch for vessels using demersal trawls and seines
  - 10t from 1<sup>st</sup> April 31<sup>st</sup> December for vessels using hook and line that meet track record requirements
  - 250kg per month for vessels using fixed gillnets that meet track records requirements
- 5. The three points above represent the only opportunities to retain Bass commercially in 2017.
- 6. For recreational fisheries from the shore and from vessels the regulation applies the following:
  - Till 30<sup>th</sup> June 2017 Bass are subject to catch release
  - From 1<sup>st</sup> July till 31<sup>st</sup> Dec 2017 one Bas per person per day may be retained

## **Significant Points**

- The regulation captures and prohibits all commercially caught Bass caught from ashore for the duration of 2017
- Which (if any) vessels will qualify for the hook/line and fixed net derogations which is specifically relevant to Byelaw 26/26 permit holder
