

# Fylde MCZ



Fylde MCZ was designated in January 2016. It protects an area of approximately 260km<sup>2</sup>. The site is located in Liverpool Bay, lying between 3 and 20km off the Fylde coast and Ribble estuary. The depth of the seabed within the site ranges from almost being exposed on low tide (just 35cm depth) to 22 metres at its deepest part.

**Designated features:** subtidal mud; subtidal sand

**Management:** Any activity that would damage the designated features of the area does not occur on the site and so therefore no management is currently required.
