The NWIFCA has assessed shrimp push netting fishing activity in the Mersey Narrows and North Wirral Foreshore European Site.

Activity data was collected by NWIFCA Fishery Officers who report that shrimp push netting in the Mersey Narrows and North Wirral Foreshore European Site has only been seen on one occasion where one fisherman push netted on a recreational basis in the north Wirral foreshore area (pers. comm. local IFCO, 2015). This activity was seen 5 years ago in 2010.

Defra's Revised Approach to the management of Fisheries in European Marine Sites (EMS) is limited to commercial fishing.

As shrimp push netting in the Mersey Narrows and North Wirral Foreshore European Site has only been carried out recreationally, the NWIFCA has screened it out of this process.

Activity will continue to be monitored and should the nature of shrimp push netting in the Mersey Narrows and North Wirral Foreshore European Site recommence and become commercial it will be assessed in accordance with the Revised Approach.
